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The Physician Assistant curriculum is very demanding and requires a solid academic foundation. Below you will find information related to prerequisite coursework requirements. ${ }^{1}$

- All prerequisite coursework must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Multiple "C" grades may make your application non-competitive.
- All prerequisite coursework must have been completed within ten (10) years before matriculation. Older coursework is not acceptable and must be repeated.
- Many colleges offer different levels of courses. The only acceptable courses are those designated for science or allied health majors. Science coursework designated for non-science majors is not acceptable.
- Coursework must be taken at a regionally accredited institution of higher learning in the United States (US). Advanced Placement (AP) credits cannot substitute for prerequisite courses that are required for admission.
- Online coursework is often acceptable, but it must be taken at a US accredited institution.
- Students with incomplete prerequisite courses may apply; however, there may be a delay in the application review process if two (2) or more prerequisite courses are pending.
- Applicants must complete all prerequisite courses and baccalaureate degree by June $1 s t$.
