



Student-Athlete Attestation Form for Compliance with the NCAA Board of Governors Policy on Campus Sexual Violence

NCAA member institutions are required to annually gather information regarding the prior misconduct of any current, prospective, or transfer student, including a graduate student, who seeks to participate in intercollegiate athletics. Accordingly, any current, prospective, or transfer student-athlete, including a graduate student, must annually disclose to Seton Hall University whether they have been disciplined through a campus proceeding or had a criminal conviction for sexual, interpersonal or other acts of violence. This misconduct is defined by the NCAA Board of Governors Policy on Campus Sexual Violence as:

- *Interpersonal Violence*: Violence that is predominantly caused due to the relationship between the victim and the perpetrator, including dating violence and domestic violence.
- *Sexual Violence*: A term used to include both forcible and nonforcible sex offenses, ranging from sexual battery to rape.
- *Other Acts of Violence*: Crimes including murder, manslaughter, aggravated assault or any assault that employs the use of a deadly weapon or causes serious bodily injury.
